## Letter from Executive Director:

Dear Friends and Partners,

2010 was a year that our relationships, partnerships and work were more deeply anchored in the La Limonada community. We are embedded in the community and working from within to educate and empower the people there. They are our neighbors and friends, and we are working alongside them to invite more of God's peace to the community through meeting needs, educating children, creating a safe haven for some who need to be rescued from neglect and abuse and paving the way for many through access to opportunities they would not have had otherwise.

In the seven years I have known Tita, her heart for La Limonada has always leaned toward a desire to provide holistic care for the children and their families. And we made significant steps in that direction in 2010. It can be challenging to see progress in a place like La Limonada, but progress is evident as a result of the hard work, dedication and prayers of so many who have followed the calling to serve the community.

A new micro-enterprise program - providing small loans to women from the community to help them start and expand small businesses, a safe home for abused, abandoned and neglected children and the groundwork for a vocational training program are all advances that were made last year.

Our existing work in the La Limonada community and these advances were made possible through your generosity. As co-workers together in God's field, we did this together. We educated, fed, loved and cared for more than 300 children who attended two schools, we provided pastoral care for people throughout the community, we provided women with loans, we taught carpentry skills to current and former gang members and we opened a home to begin caring for abused, abandoned and neglected children.

We have made a difference together! And we invite you to continue on this journey together.

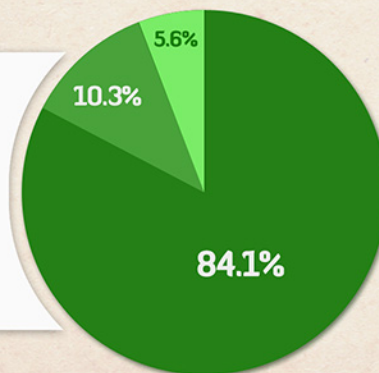
